

Fitzharrys GCSE results 2026

It was wonderful to congratulate students at Fitzharrys School as they received their GCSE results this morning. This cohort should be very proud of their achievements, which reflect their talent, determination, and application.



Students achieved well across the curriculum, and teachers from across their subjects were in school to celebrate with them. In terms of key measures, 66% of students achieved a 9-4 in English and Maths, 48% achieved a 9-5 in English and Maths. This was another great set of exam results at Fitzharrys School, continuing a pattern of positive outcomes for young people over the last 5 years.

Among a range of successes were Matteo, Jack, Ethan, Izzy, and Lucy (pictured left). Izzy achieved 9 GCSEs at grade 9, alongside one grade 8 and a distinction in performing arts. Ethan had ten grades between 9-7, five of which were at grade 9. Lucy received ten grades between 9 and 7, alongside a distinction for performing arts. Jack and Matteo also did superbly with Jack getting eight GCSEs at grade 8, whilst Matteo received 8 grades between 9-7.

Sam, Maria, and Mae (pictured right) also did brilliantly, with some excellent grades. Sam achieved seven grade 9 amongst his 11 GCSEs at grade 9-7. Maria and Mae both achieved nine GCSEs between grade 9-7. Wills, Adam, George, and Ruban (pictured right) also had superb results, all achieving results dominated by 7s, 8s, and 9s. Wills had ten 9-7 grades, Adam and Ruban both achieved nine 9-7 grades, and George received eight 9-7 grades.

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Fitzharrys School is proud of the achievements of all our students. It has been a pleasure to see such brilliant outcomes for them. The atmosphere in the hall was wonderful, with students, teachers, and parents celebrating together. We wish them the very best in their next steps. Half of this cohort will join JMF6, our shared sixth form, to study A levels and other level 3 qualifications, while other students will head off to other post-16 education and apprenticeships. It has been a privilege to be part of their development, and we know they will continue to achieve great things in the next stage of their education and training.
