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Dear parents and carers,

As ever, thank you for your support across a packed term. The last couple of weeks has featured brilliant whole school events, including the wonderful Carol Concert, Key Stage 4 quiz, and the Staff Pantomime. In these events, and those across the term, we have seen students take leading roles and responsibilities superbly, enacting our school values throughout.

## **Aspiration**

Year 11 students have sat mock exams, received results, and reflected on them carefully. Year 10 students have taken part in the OX14 LP Business Language challenge. Year 9 students have taken part in a STEM careers event, whilst JMF6 students have taken part in the Senior Kangaroo and Olympiad events. The Oxford Academy of Broadcast Journalism has seen students continue to develop key journalism skills. Alongside all these events, we have seen hard work and application in our calm and focussed learning environment; it is a pleasure to see students working so well in school.

## **Opportunity**

Sporting fixtures have been wide ranging, with our year 11 boys unfortunately losing out in the county cup football semi-final. There have also been fixtures for our rugby, netball, cross country, and badminton teams. Rehearsals for the school production of 'Shrek' have been continuing, whilst A level English students have visited the Theatre to see 'Medea'. A level Media Studies students have visited Warner Brothers Studios, and a range of students went to Wembley to see the Lionesses in action. All of this alongside the wealth of clubs and opportunities in school.

## Integrity

A group of students continue to regularly visit the Leafield Care Home to work with residents. Students have also shown leadership in their fundraising for Children in Need, and other charities. The year 9 Sexual Health wider learning day and the recent prisoner talk helped develop students understanding of social issues. The launch of our leadership academy allowed those students to develop their wider leadership skills. These events sit alongside the daily routines where students consistently learn and demonstrate their empathy and support for others in our community.

Yesterday and today our award assemblies have seen students receive a range of certificates to celebrate their achievements in our three core values, ensuring recognition for their efforts in school. It has been a pleasure to celebrate such a high number of students reaching house point milestones. This is part of the new awards process which was launched in September. He has been in school to meet the team over the last week or so, and we look forward to him starting in January.

## Term 3

All students are due back at Fitzharrys on Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> January. There will be a wide range of activities and events in the new year, details of which will be sent out in the curriculum letters that you will receive in the first week back.

When we do return to school, please can I request your support with regards parking at the front of school at the end of each day. The council, local residents, and Thames Valley Police have been in contact around people parking on the green, as well as blocking access for local residents. We have had a couple of near misses and disputes which have prompted collective action by all stakeholders. Please refrain from parking on the green, in bus bays, or blocking driveways. Parking a little further away and asking your child to walk, will, whilst being less convenient, reduce traffic, limit damage, and mitigate risk in an already busy and congested area. We really appreciate your support with this.

We will also be having a particular uniform push in the new year. Though I regularly put in a reminder about this in the newsletter, some areas of our uniform policy are not being consistently adhered to. Hoodies, trainers, and jewellery will be areas of focus, so please ensure your child is dressed correctly for the new term. I will remind students of our expectations in the start of term assemblies, and our pastoral team will offer guidance and support for those not clear on correct uniform.
