2023-24: Term 1 Overview

Our Overview newsletters are designed to contain all the key information you'll need each term.

Learning

ENGLISH:

GCSE Poetry

Students study the remainder of the poems in the GCSE collection which they began in Year 9. Ms Corfield and Miss Hartley's classes are studying the Worlds and Lives collection, and Mr O'Neill and Miss Sinclair are studying the Power and Conflict collection. Both groups will practise giving attention to analysis of language, structure and form, and contextual factors. Students will learn to construct comparative analytical paragraphs to GCSE standard. Students will learn how to approach unseen poems.

MATHS:

Individual class focus for this term:

- Miss Morgan & Mrs Payne's class: Percentages with Miss Morgan, and Ratio and Proportion with Mrs Payne
- **Miss Keeble's class:** Percentages building on prior knowledge to calculate and interpret percentage changes, with a particular focus on worded and multi-step problems.
- **Mr Smytheman's class**, **Mr Whitley's class**, and **Mr Poolman's class**: Percentages we will use diagnostic tests to enhance existing knowledge from Year 8. Consistent use of "multipliers" and calculators can deeply strengthen this topic, which has significant links to other subjects too.

TRIPLE SCIENCE:

In **Biology**, students will study the circulatory, respiratory and plant organ systems. They will develop an understanding of transport of substances in different organisms.

In **Chemistry**, students will study reactivity, displacement, and the production of salts in reactions. They will also study neutralisation, acids, and alkalis.

In **Physics**, students study electrical circuits. They will look at the behaviour of series and parallel circuits, calculate and measure voltages, current and resistance in various circuits, and complete required practicals to investigate resistance.

COMBINED SCIENCE:

In **Combined Science**, students will study a **Biology** topic on the circulatory, respiratory and plant organ systems. They also study a **Physics** topic looking at electrical circuits. They will look at the behaviour of series and parallel circuits, calculating and measuring voltages, current and resistance in various circuits and completed required practicals to investigate resistance.

PSHE:

Being Me In My World: Year 10 students reflect on liberty, safety, and global perspectives. They navigate the emotional intricacies of grief and understand social media's influence on identity. The course emphasises online 'netiquette' and teaches proactive risk management in digital and real-world contexts.
