

2023-24: Term 3 Overview

Our Overview newsletters contain the key information you'll need each term.

Briefing on curriculum content, extra-curricular opportunities, current school messages and more, parents and carers can use this outline to support students and help them succeed at school.

Learning

ENGLISH:

Creative Writing, Lord of the Flies, and Romeo and Juliet

Students will conclude their study of *Lord of the Flies* with some creative writing work inspired by Golding's style. They will then study Shakespeare's play *Romeo and Juliet*.

MATHS: Individual class focus for this term:

- Mrs Payne & Miss Morgan's class: Sequences & Graphs, and Congruence & Similarity
- Miss Keeble's class: Angles, and Algebra
- Mr Whitley's class: Pythagoras & Trigonometry, before moving on to Angles
- Mr Smytheman's class: Pythagoras & Trigonometry, before moving on to Angles
- Mr Poolman's class: Angles Pythagoras & Trigonometry

SEPARATE SCIENCES:

In **Biology**, students will study non-communicable diseases, their treatment and risk factors. They will move on to look at photosynthesis, the importance of this reaction, and the uses of glucose. As part of this they will complete a key required practical.

In **Chemistry**, students will study energy changes in chemical reactions and calculate the energy released or taken in during exothermic and endothermic reactions. They will study crude oil, fuels, and the products of combustion.

In **Physics**, students will be studying atomic structure and look at the properties, uses and dangers associated with nuclear radiation. They will also look at the nuclear reactions of fission and fusion.

COMBINED SCIENCE

In Combined Science, students will study **Biology** topics looking at non-communicable diseases and risk factor for disease, as well as a topic on photosynthesis and the uses of glucose. They will look at a **Physics** topic studying the particle model of matter, and look at the kinetic theory for solids, liquids, and gases. They will calculate and experimentally determine the density of objects, and look at changes of state and specific latent heat.

CORE PE:

Students will be working in competitive and semi competitive situations. Some students use the time to develop their confidence in their GCSE PE practical areas and others participate in a more recreational but purposeful way. Our 'healthy active lifestyles' motto remains at the core of everything we do.

PSHE:

We will explore our Dreams & Goals, focusing on the balance between physical and emotional needs for success. This sequence will delve into relationships, health goals, work/life balance, and the importance of community in achieving these aspirations. Emphasis will be placed on resilience, mental health, and nurturing important relationships, providing a comprehensive understanding of achieving personal goals.

Year 10 will have their first full set of mock exams in March at the end of term 4. Students will be informed in class about how to prepare for these and will spend some time in lessons preparing. YEAR 10 REWARD TRIP

Following consultation with the Student Council and a vote across the whole year group, the Year 10 reward trip will be an afternoon at Xscape in Milton Keynes at the trampoline park and bowling centre, likely to be planned for April. More details will follow in due course once confirmed.

Behaviour choices may impact students' ability to participate. Students will be eligible to attend the trip if they have a positive number of House points of at least 50. Sanctions represent negatives with escalating levels of severity. At this stage, it is still possible for every Year 10 student to attend the reward trip but, if your child becomes concerned that they may not meet the threshold, they can ask their form tutor for support in getting back on track.
