# Learning

### **ENGLISH:**

### **Non-Fiction Reading**

Students will learn to compare the content, and the attitudes, of two non-fiction texts, in preparation for English Language Paper 2. They will learn strategies for approaching nineteenth century non-fiction.

### **MATHS:**

Individual class focus for this term, in conjunction with wider revision work in relation to the Year 10 exams:

- Mr Poolman's, Mr Smytheman's and Mr Whitley's classes: Angles, Algebra skills
- Mrs Payne & Miss Morgan's class: Sequences and graphs, Congruence and similarity
- Miss Keeble's class: 3D shapes, revisiting and building on work from KS3

#### SCIENCE:

### **Triple Science**

In **Biology**, students will study the topic of photosynthesis and then move on to look at respiration. They will focus on the importance of this reaction, both aerobic and anaerobic, for organisms as a whole and the impact exercise has on the body.

In **Chemistry**, students will study crude oil and fuels. They will look at how crude oil is separated into useful fractions and look at different hydrocarbon molecules and their properties.

In **Physics**, students will be studying atomic structure, looking at the properties and dangers associated with nuclear radiation, and the use of radioactivity in industry and medicine. They will also study the nuclear reactions of fission and fusion.

### **Combined Science**

In Combined Science, students will study a **Biology** topic looking at respiration, both aerobic and anaerobic, and the effect of exercise on the body. They will also study a **Physics** topic focused on atomic structure, looking at the properties and dangers associated with nuclear radiation, and the use of radioactivity in industry and medicine.

### **Core PE:**

Students will be working in competitive and semi competitive situations. Some students use the time to develop their confidence in their GCSE PE practical areas and others participate in a more recreational but purposeful way. Our 'healthy active lifestyles' motto remains at the core of everything we do.

### **PSHE:**

In PSHE, we will explore a comprehensive *Healthy Me* programme that equips individuals with the knowledge and skills to make informed decisions about their physical and mental health. Covering a range of topics from understanding health risks to the importance of safe sexual practices and mental wellbeing, this term's PSHE topic is designed to empower pupils with strategies for preventing lifestyle-related illnesses and promoting overall health.
