

# **2024-25: Term 2 Overview**

## **Learning**

#### **ENGLISH:**

#### Revising English Language Papers 1 and 2

Students will learn to hone their examination technique for both sections of both papers, building on practices and feedback loops. Students will also respond to feedback on their mock exams.

#### **MATHS:**

Students will receive comprehensive feedback following the mock exams to help them identify key areas of revision and focus. The individual class focus for this term is as follows:

- Mrs Morgan & Mrs Payne's class: Simultaneous Equations and Further Graphs
- Miss Twyford & Mrs Price's class: Simultaneous Equations, Measures and Graphs
- Mr Poolman's class: Mock Exam Development, Probability Skills
- Mr Smytheman's & Mr Whitley's classes: Mock exam development, Data

#### **SEPARATE SCIENCES:**

In **Biology**, students will be studying inheritance. They will look at the inheritance of single gene characteristics, learn about alleles, genotypes, phenotypes, and some inherited disorders.

In **Chemistry**, students will study a topic on analytical chemistry looking at tests for gases, ions, and chromatography. They will also complete investigative work on these topics.

In **Physics**, students will continue to study the topic of forces, looking at the motion of objects in detail, Newton's laws, conservation of momentum, and pressure in fluids.

#### **COMBINED SCIENCE:**

In Combined Science, students will be studying a **Chemistry** topic looking at crude oil and its uses as a fuel. They will also look at identifying different ions and separating mixtures. In **Physics**, students will continue the topic of forces, looking at Newton's laws of motion, factors affecting acceleration, and the effects of forces on materials.

#### **CORE PE:**

In Core PE lessons, all Key Stage 4 students will have continued opportunities to enjoy competitive or semi-competitive activity. We encourage students to embrace their core PE lessons and participate with good effort and spirit. Students will be able to choose an activity from a range of Core PE activities on offer.

#### **PSHE:**

Dreams & Goals - We will equip ourselves with strategies to handle anxiety, grasp financial planning and its challenges, pinpoint dream job aspirations, reflect on future relationships and their legal aspects, prepare for unexpected setbacks, and evaluate our pathways to achieve overarching health, relationship, and life goals.

#### **MOCK EXAMS**

The mocks are now underway and are the best opportunity Year II students will have to experience the pressure of examinations, as well as to practise the behaviours and skills that will benefit them for their GCSEs. The mock exams allow students to apply all the revision and examination strategies they have learned and discover what works best for them, helping them to focus their attention and effort, and make sure they are on the path to exam success. Students have been given their own exam timetables; parents can find a mock exams timetable on our **Exams Office** webpage. #### **MOCK EXAM RESULTS**

On Thursday 5th December, Year 11 students will have a special assembly where they will receive their mock exam results. We do this to replicate, in some way, the process that happens on the real results day in the summer. Students are then given time to reflect on their progress since their last mock exams and set targets for the final GCSEs. Students will receive copies of their results alongside their Impact Progress Check report. This report will include a target for each subject that, if completed, will aid your child's progress. We would be very grateful to have your support in encouraging students to complete these targets. A digital version of the Impact Progress Check report will be available on My Child at School.

#### **CAREERS FAIR**

We are hosting a Careers Fair during the school day on Thursday 5th December. A variety of employers and training providers from our local community will set up stalls in the hall; organisations already booked to attend include universities, colleges, and the NHS. Students will have the opportunity to informally speak to employers about their business and potential job roles, apprenticeships, and pathways into employment and training.

#### **PASSPORT TO PROM - 2025**

The Year 11 Prom will be held on Friday 4th July 2025 - please save the date! It is always a wonderful event, and we would like to see every Year 11 student there. The year group will be consulted on the theme and other ideas to make it a memorable evening for all and there is the opportunity for students to join the Prom Committee to help with fundraising and coordination of the event.

To support high aspirations and the further development of integrity in our students as they approach their exams, we use an 'In It to Win It' points system for students to earn their invitation to the prom. Students earn their *Passport to Prom* by being awarded 25 House points a term, in at least 3 of out of the 5 terms (Year II students leave school during term 6). One House point equates to one 'In It to Win' It point. All students who have not successfully accrued enough House points in a term will be notified at the beginning of the following term, and a notification will be emailed to parents. Students are aware that 'In It to Win it' points will be subtracted for each poor behaviour incident or missed homework, so please regularly encourage your child to aspire to earn House points, be proactive in their learning, make the right choices, and fulfil commitments for behaviour and personal study.
