Year 11



2023-24: Term 3 Overview

Our Overview newsletters contain the key information you'll need each term.

Briefing on curriculum content, extra-curricular opportunities, current school messages and more, parents and carers can use this outline to support students and help them succeed at school.

Learning

ENGLISH:

Revising Literature Paper 1

Students will learn to hone their knowledge of both *Romeo and Juliet* and *Jekyll and Hyde*, and to refine their ideas, building on practices and feedback loops.

MATHS: Individual class focus for this term:

- Mr Poolman's class: Transformation of Graphs, and Direct and Inverse Proportion Problems
- Mrs Payne & Miss Morgan's class: Graphs, Quadratics, Simultaneous Equations and Functions
- Mr Whitley's class: Data, Maths Memory skills
- Mrs Twyford's class: Transformations, Data, Compound Measures and Constructions
- Mrs Price's class: Core skills revision for GCSE exams

SEPARATE SCIENCES:

In **Biology**, students will study ecosystems, focusing on interdependence between organisms and measuring abundance and distribution of a population. They will study nutrient cycles and complete a required practical focused on decay.

In **Chemistry**, students will continue the study of organic chemistry looking at polymers and their many uses. They will also study chemical analysis and look at the tests that can be used to identify substances and ions. They go on to look at the Earth's resources where they study water and water treatment, extracting metals from their ores, and recycling of materials.

In **Physics**, students will continue with the topic of forces, looking at pressure on surfaces, in fluids, and the causes of upthrust. They will then begin a topic on magnetism looking at the fields around permanent magnets and electromagnets. They will carry out experiments to investigate these fields.

COMBINED SCIENCE

Students will study a **Biology** topic on nutrient cycles. They will then look at the impacts of humans on biodiversity including deforestation, global warming, and pollution. In **Chemistry**, they will study the components of the earth's atmosphere and treating wastewater. In **Physics** they will study a topic on waves looking at wave properties and in particular electromagnetic waves and their many uses.

CORE PE:

Students studing GCSE PE will be preparing for their practical examinations with a close end date in mind. To support this, we encourage them to use Core PE classes as an opportunity to work on their specific areas of need.

Students who are not taking GCSE PE will use their Core PE time productively, following their 'healthy active lifestyle', by working on their own programmes in our Fitness suite or with semi-competitive activity in games situations.

PSHE:

In PSHE, we will explore 'Healthy Me' by understanding decision-making in sexual relationships, the role of self-worth, consent, contraception, and diverse views on sexual health. Pupils will learn about hormonal health's influence on life, the importance of respecting different beliefs, and effective strategies for managing pressures in relationships.

IMPACT PROGRESS CHECK

Following their mock exams in Term 2, students received an impact progress check. Feedback included specific targets to work on for each subject, set by their teachers. The targets, if completed, will have a positive impact on your child's GCSE performance. We ask for parents' support to ensure that students are working to achieve these targets: please check regularly to see if they have completed them and encourage them to progress.

Hard copies of the impact progress checks were sent home via students in the usual way. A digital copy can be accessed via your **My Child at School** login. If you experience any difficulties accessing this information, please **contact** your child's tutor.

POST-16 PATHWAYS

Year 11 students can at times feel overwhelmed by pressures of coursework completion and revising for the upcoming final exams. As such, exploring pathways for life after Year 11 and completing applications can feel like an additional burden. The Key Stage 4 pastoral team are here to help and will provide support and guidance.

Every Year 11 student at Fitzharrys School will receive an appointment with an external career advisor who can help provide a realistic picture of the options for next steps. If your child has not yet had their appointment but would like to be prioritised, they should let their form tutor know and we will make the arrangements.

MARCH MOCK EXAMS

It would be helpful if you can check in regularly with your child to ensure they are prepared and on track to meet these. Thank you for your support in the run up to GCSE exams.

It is essential that students are fully equipped for their exams, ensuring they have pens, pencils, an eraser, ruler calculator, compass, and protractor. Compasses and protractors can be hired for student services for 50p each if needed. Students will not be able to borrow equipment from school during the mock exams. If there are any issues with organising this equipment, please contact your child's tutor who will be able to provide support.

It is not supervised by staff, but students can arrange to meet with their teachers there to go over aspects of the course. It is furnished with a good range of revision guides and resources.

KS4 WELLBEING EVENTS

Fitzharrys School aims to balance students' hard work in their GCSE lessons with providing opportunities where they can prioritise their wellbeing. PASSPORT TO PROM

The Year 11 Prom will be held on Friday 5th July 2024 and every member of Year 11 is welcome. Please be reminded that we are utilising a 'Passport to Prom' system to support high aspirations and the further development of integrity in our students as they approach their exams. Tickets will become available to students who have positive score of at least 50 House points by the time the final exams begin in May. Students are aware that points will be subtracted for each sanction (e.g. a poor behaviour incident or missed homework), so please encourage your child to aspire to earn House points and fulfil commitments for behaviour and personal study. We want every student to attend Prom and are here to offer support wherever needed. If your child is concerned about their eligibility, it is not too late! The pastoral team will provide discreet support to get back on track and develop the right mindset to have a successful end to Year 11.
