

2023-24: Term 1 Overview

Our Overview newsletters are designed to contain the key information you'll need each term.

Briefing on curriculum content, extra-curricular opportunities, current school messages and more, parents and carers can use this outline to support students and help them succeed at school.

Learning

ENGLISH: Non-fiction Reading and Writing - Students will study a range of non-fiction speeches from orators from a range of cultures and contexts. They will produce an analytical reading of a speech and write a speech themselves.

MATHS: Our first topic in Year 7 is *Number Operations*. This is the underpinning topic for all other areas of maths, covering the four operations, working with decimals and negatives and BIDMAS. We also explore how to use letters to generalise number and gently introduce algebraic concepts into mathematics.

SCIENCE: Students will complete an introductory topic to science focusing on key practical enquiry skills. They will move on to a biology topic focusing on cell structure and transport in cells.

ART: Students will practice observational drawing, developing skills in tone and texture which will underpin their journey through KS3 and KS4 in Art and Design.

COMPUTER SCIENCE: Students will learn how to use email accounts, as well as online systems: Learning Resources, e-Praise, and One Drive. This term's topic is *Online Safety*: Cyberbullying, Computer Viruses and Passwords.

DRAMA: Students are introduced to skills such as Mime and Gesture, and work on creating characters for the end of term assessment, entitled: 'Bar Story'.

FRENCH: The sound of French - Introducing phonics via songs and self-description. Students will study a range of key basic concepts such as phonics, articles, subject pronouns, and key verbs (to be/to have).

GEOGRAPHY: Wonderful World – What is my place in the world? Introducing physical and human features of the geographical world, e.g. locating countries, continents, and oceans.

HISTORY: Students are introduced to key historical skills such as chronology, and then we look at what makes us British, and the impact migration has had on the UK over the last two thousand years.

MANDARIN: Students will focus on learning how to greet other people and Count from 0-10 in Chinese.

MUSIC: Night and Day: The Elements of Music - Pupils will be learning about the key building blocks of what makes Music, music. This term, they will be particularly focusing on Dynamics (volume) and Tempo (speed).

PHILOSOPHY & ETHICS: What are key Hindu beliefs? An investigation into key aspects of Hindu belief including gods and goddesses, worship, holy books and texts, holy places, and pilgrimage.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION: Most students will be developing their skills and exploring the principals of Invasion Games (Netball and Rugby). Some will experience a Dance activity with simple choreographed routines, allowing them to enjoy PE in a different way. The focus for all is on high levels of activity and participation as well as establishing consistent routines and encouraging independence.

PSHE: Being Me in My World: We will look at what makes us unique and how we can support others to be unique. We will assess who influences us and how they affect our emotions and actions. We will assess our online footprints.

TECHNOLOGY: Students follow a rotational system, all starting at different points. Key topics covered across year 7 are: a Christmas cracker project, designing a phone pod, making a drawstring bag, and key knife skills for cooking.

NEW FITZHARRYS AWARDS SYSTEM

Our new Fitzharrys Awards launch this term, recognising our students' achievements that reflect our core values: Aspiration, Opportunity, Integrity. Every student can work towards achieving Bronze, Silver, and Gold awards by completing a series of activities that support the development of our core values. Each student will be issued with an Awards Booklet to record evidence of their progress. A guide for parents detailing the new awards system will follow in the coming weeks.

COGNATIVE ABILITY TESTS (CATS)

On Tuesday 19th September, Year 7 students will complete cognitive ability tests, sometimes referred to as CATs. The CAT4 assesses four areas:

- Verbal Reasoning: the ability to reason with words representing objects or concepts
- Non-Verbal Reasoning: the ability to reason with shapes and patterns
- Quantitative Reasoning: the ability to identify numerical relationships
- Spatial Ability: the ability to reason with shapes to transform visual images

We use these assessments to understand more about our new students and how best to teach them. CATs differ from SATs in that they test cognitive ability rather than knowledge. There is no need to revise for the CATs tests.

Students will also complete a reading assessment within their first term at Fitzharrys. This is used as a baseline to assess progress and to help teachers plan effectively for individual students' needs.

APPROACH TO LEARNING REPORT

Expected during w/c 9th October, reports on how Year 7 students have been getting on in their first term will be sent out to parents. All subjects will provide scores for the student's *Approach to Learning* and *Approach to Homework*.
