2023-24: Term 1 Overview

Our Overview newsletters are designed to contain the key information you'll need each term. Briefing on curriculum content, extra-curricular opportunities, current school messages and more, parents and carers can use this outline to support students and help them succeed at school.

Learning

ENGLISH: *England Poetry* – Students will study a range of poetry from across the ages, inspired by, and dealing with, the idea of England. Students will learn to compare poetic method and will produce a comparison of two poems.

MATHS: We will be covering a topic on Fractions, Decimals, Percentages and Ratio & Proportion. This is a key topic which connects to many other mathematical topics, including probability – and contains a core set of number skills for numeracy in other subjects.

SCIENCE: Students will first study a biology topic on the Respiratory System and the effect of drugs such as alcohol and smoking on the body. They will go on to study a physics topic on the effect of Forces on objects and pressure.

ART: We begin to look at Architecture; taking inspiration from a range of artists including Simon Ling, John Constable, and Beomsik Won. Students will explore drawing techniques in pencil and pen. They will look at their immediate surrounding at school, and make their own source images using collaging to create "monster buildings".

COMPUTER SCIENCE: Students will develop their knowledge of Online Safety, including issues like online grooming, sexting, selfies, keeping a positive digital footprint, and the impact of screen time on physical and mental health.

DRAMA: Students begin with performances of 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory', before revisiting Physical Theatre (introduced in year 7) to create a slow-motion piece called *The Crash*, using a technique called 'Thought Tracking'.

FRENCH: Going back to school - What is school like in France? What about Harry Potter? Students will revisit key verbs in the present tense. They will describe their day and give opinions about school.

GEOGRAPHY: A Risky World – Are natural hazards more dangerous than ever before? Exploring the structure of the Earth, looking at how the tectonic plates move and how this forms hazards, such as earthquakes and volcanoes.

HISTORY: Students look at the history of the British Empire and the impact that has had on the world around us. They will then decide whether they think we should be proud of the British Empire.

MUSIC: Reggae - Pupils will learn about the historical context and the key musical elements of Reggae.

PHILOSOPHY & ETHICS: Does religion cause or reduce inequality? A discussion of the extent of inequality in our world today, looking at topics including sport, gender, racism, and homelessness, reaching a judgement of how religion impacts this inequality.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION: Students will develop their skills and explore more advanced principals in two specific Invasion Games: Netball and Rugby.

PSHE: This term PSHE focuses in greater depth on *Being me in my World*, looking at family and family factors, faith and beliefs, and the power of first impressions. Students will ask themselves this question: "Who am !?"

SPANISH: Spanish basics - Students will study Spanish pronunciation, articles, adjectives, and negative sentences.

TECHNOLOGY: Students follow a rotational system, all starting at different points. Key topics covered in year 8 are: designing a mechanical toy, a boom box, making a drawstring bag, and a unit of Food Tech exploring cafe culture.
