

2023-24: Term 1 Overview

Our Overview newsletters are designed to contain all the key information you'll need each term.

Learning

ENGLISH: Speaking and Writing for Change - Students will read An Inspector Calls, as well as a range of non-fiction texts broadly focusing on gender and class from the 1800s to the present day. Students will explore oracy skills and will write and perform a speech on an issue that matters to them.

MATHS: In year 9, students begin to create their blue book GCSE revision guide. We study *Number* in term one, including different types of numbers and their uses. We also ensure that number skills are secure as they form the foundation of all future topics. We then move on to rounding and accuracy.

SCIENCE: Students will study a biology topic on cell structure and transport in cells involving key required practicals. Students will either study a chemistry topic on atomic structure, ions and separation techniques, or they will complete a physics topic looking at conservation of energy and energy transfers.

ART: Using the photography of Tim Flach, students will begin developing work in response to endangered species. They will refine their skills in Colour Pencil by looking at the work of Tim Jeffs before exploring skills in Monoprinting, inspired by the work of Andy Warhol from his Endangered & Vanishing species series.

COMPUTER SCIENCE: Students will learn about techniques used by cybercriminals to steal data, disrupt systems, and infiltrate networks. They study social engineering and cybercrimes like hacking, DDoS attacks, malware, and methods used to protect the individual and networks against attacks.

DRAMA: Students revisit the concepts of Status and Proxemics in our 'Master and Servant' performances, in a scene adapted from Shakespeare's *The Tempest*.

FRENCH: Family and friends - Who am I and who are my family and friends? Students will revisit "être" and "avoir", possessive adjectives and the verb "s'appeler". They will use the comparative and the superlative.

GEOGRAPHY: Cracking Coasts – How does the sea shape our coastlines? This topic focuses on the processes that act on the coast, and the features that are formed by erosion and deposition. Also, how coastal management plays an important part in shaping the coastlines.

HISTORY: Interwar years and Weimar Germany - This term we are looking at how Germany recovered after World War One and how this led to the Second World War.

MUSIC: Film Music - Pupils will be studying the use of leitmotifs (a short, recurring musical phrase associated with a character, place, or idea) by film composers. They will create a film trailer that builds tension.

PHILOSOPHY & ETHICS: What challenges exist to religion today? An evaluation of how far the existence of secularism, humanism, atheism, and alternative belief systems pose a problem for mainstream religion.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION: Students continue to develop their skills in two major Invasion Games: Netball and Rugby.

PSHE: This term PSHE focuses in greater depth on *Being me in my World*, looking at expectations and perceptions of relationships, consent, peer approval, and being me in a group, as well as risks and social influences.

SPANISH: Who am I and who are my family and friends? Students will revisit the use of "ser" / "tener" and adjectives

TECHNOLOGY: Students follow a rotational system, all starting at different points. Key topics covered in year 9 are: making a drawstring bag designed via various finishing techniques, a unit of Food Tech exploring a range of mainly savoury main meals, a seasonal electronics project, and a making a jewellery box.


