

2023-24: Term 2 Overview

Our Overview newsletters are designed to contain the key information you'll need each term.

Briefing on curriculum content, extra-curricular opportunities, current school messages and more, parents and carers can use this outline to support students and help them succeed at school.

Learning

ENGLISH: Speaking and Writing for Change - Students will conclude their study of texts that speak and write for change, culminating in a speech of their own. They will begin a creative writing unit, focusing on writers' choices.

MATHS: This term we will be moving on to *Algebra* – the language of mathematics. Learning to speak, write and read as a mathematician enables students to generalise and solve complex problems.

SCIENCE: All students will study a chemistry topic on atomic structure, ions, and separation techniques. They will also either cover a physics topic on energy transfer by heating or they will look at a biology topic on cell structure and the transport and exchange of substances.

ART: Endangered Species - students revisit the work of Tim Jeffs, focussing on his observational drawings using pencil. Students explore drawing and painting techniques inspired by the *To the Bone* series by street artist: Sonny.

COMPUTER SCIENCE: Students begin basic programming in Python, creating a simple chatbot which will respond to user input. Students will also write simple codes using sequence, selection and iteration programming constructs.

DRAMA: Students continue work on characters and scenes from *The Tempest*, with a focus on comic techniques and further refinement of physical theatre skills. They will also learn and practice an Elizabethan dance called *The Pilgrim and Saints dance* as part of our final performance of the play.

FRENCH: Technology - How do I use technology and what do I think of it? Students will revise the near future and study the future. Students will revise regular verbs in the present tense and common irregular verbs.

GEOGRAPHY: How can we help people in developing countries? Understanding why some countries are more developed than others. Identifying ways we can measure development and compare countries' standards of living.

HISTORY: The rise of the Nazis - We investigate the reasons why Hitler and the Nazi party gained increasing support from the German people following on from the successes of the Weimar government in the 1920s.

MUSIC: Rock n' Roll - Pupils will study how Rock n' Roll evolved from the Blues (which they studied in Year 8). They will be studying how it differs, and how it leads to contemporary commercial Popular Music.

PHILOSOPHY & ETHICS: Are science and religion compatible? We assess how religious beliefs, including revelations and miracles, compare with scientific theories about space, creation and design, the beginning of life and causation.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION: Students continue to develop skills in Invasion Games: Netball, Football and Rugby, before moving on to cardiovascular fitness with a progressive training programme, ending in an inter-house competition.

PSHE: Celebrating Difference – Students address key questions around diversity, discrimination, and bullying. Learners will explore the importance of positive language, the effects of bullying, and how to challenge and protect themselves against prejudice and discrimination.

SPANISH: Relationships - Can I share opinions on friendships and marriage? Students will revise the near future and the possessive adjectives.

TECHNOLOGY: Students follow a rotational system, all starting at different points. Key topics covered in year 9 are: making a drawstring bag designed via various finishing techniques, a unit of Food Tech exploring a range of mainly savoury main meals, a seasonal electronics project, and a making a jewellery box.

Year 9 students will have a Sexual Health wider-learning day at school on Tuesday 14th November. Supported by the School Nurse and **The Abingdon Bridge** as well as other professionals, students will learn about consent and boundary setting, contraception, STIs, and healthy relationships, in a carousel of talks.
