2023-24: Term 4 Overview

Learning

ENGLISH: *Macbeth* - Students will study the Shakespeare play *Macbeth*, being introduced to aspects of Tragedy. Students will produce an analytical essay exploring theme, character, language, structure, form, and context, in an extract from the play and the play as a whole.

MATHS: Students will revisit fractions and decimals, work on solving equations, and continue to practice past paper questions regularly to help them prepare for the assessments that take place at the end of the school year.

SCIENCE: All classes will complete a Biology topic focused on the digestive system and enzymes and the chemistry of food and food tests. They will also complete a Chemistry topic on structure and bonding, looking in detail at how elements bond together to form compounds. Students will also undertake a Physics topic looking at the different methods used to generate electricity, and the advantages and disadvantages associated with each method.

ART: *Ceramics* - Taking inspiration from the work of Kate Malone, Peter Randall-Page, Karl Blossfeldt and others students will build, decorate, and glaze tiles and pots around a theme of natural forms. Students will first build test tiles and create inspiration sketchbooks which they will fill with observational drawings in a range of media.

COMPUTER SCIENCE: Students will learn several key algorithms that reflect computational thinking. They will use logical reasoning to compare the utility of alternative algorithms for the same problem.

DRAMA: Year 9 students will use the Eminem song *Stan* as a dramatic exploration, focusing on non-naturalistic drama techniques such as Externalised Conscience and Thought Tracking.

FRENCH: Food - What do I eat and is it healthy? Students will learn about quantities and revisit the use of partitive articles.

GEOGRAPHY: *Wild Weather* – How is the weather getting wilder? Students will examine the difference between weather and climate, before studying hurricanes in depth.

HISTORY: Students will investigate the harsh facts of the Holocaust that took place in Europe during the 1930s and 1940s. They will assess why we should remember the Holocaust in the 21st century.

MUSIC: *Minimalism* - Pupils will be learning about the movement in the arts of Minimalism. Pupils will study Minimalist pieces of music and their composition techniques.

PHILOSOPHY & ETHICS: Does religion make evil and suffering easier to bare? A discussion of the problem of evil and the concept of suffering through the lenses of Christianity and Buddhism, and an assessment of Global Goals relating to the eradication of poverty around the world.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION: Students in Term 4 will be developing their skills in a competitive way in Badminton, Fitness, and Basketball on a rotational basis.

PSHE: *Healthy Me*: Students cover the teenage brain's amazing abilities, understanding and protecting it against risks, the impact of social groups, life-saving skills, and mental health first aid. We'll learn to make informed decisions, seek help when needed, and foster healthy physical and mental lifestyles.

SPANISH: Sport and free time - What do I do in my free time? Is sport important and what sport will I do in the future? Students will revisit the use of "jugar", "hacer" and opinions. Students will learn the future tense.

TECHNOLOGY: Students follow a rotational system, all starting at different points. Key topics covered in year 9 are: making a drawstring bag designed via various finishing techniques, a unit of Food Tech exploring a range of mainly savoury main meals, a seasonal electronics project, and a making a jewellery box.
