Subject	What will be in the exam?	How can I revise?
Art	<p>We are working on your exam portfolio. Final deadline is the first exam day (24<sup>th</sup> April). At this time you will have to hand in all boards for assessment; you are not allowed to take them home again or work on them following the exam days.</p> <p>The exam is worth 40% of the final grade.</p> <p>By the end of Term 4 you should have completed the majority of work for your exam and have a good idea of what your outcome will be.</p> <p>Use the checklist you were given at the start of the exam project to ensure you are up to date.</p>	<p>Make sure that you are keeping on top of your exam portfolio work, especially the idea exploration and development.</p> <p>The art rooms are open for GCSE students to complete work at lunchtime and by prior arrangement after school.</p> <p>Look back at old boards and ensure they are complete and make clear connections to your ideas.</p>
Biology	<p>The mock exam will be a Biology paper 2. The topics for Chemistry will be Rates of chemical change, Organic chemistry, Chemical analysis, Chemistry of the atmosphere and Using Earth's resources. The topics for Physics will be Forces, Waves and Magnetism and electromagnetism.</p> <p>You will need to have a ruler and a calculator for these papers. Maths	<p>You will take 3 full Maths GCSE exam papers. That cover all the content taught since year 9 and some content from KS3. For some of you there will be very limited</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Your blue book revision guides you have been creating since the start of Y9 are a great place to start revising and revisiting what you have covered.</li> </ul>

	<p>number of questions on content which has not yet been fully covered, particularly if you are taking a higher tier paper. This is normal and will be accounted for in your predicted grade</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Paper 1 – non calculator</li> <li>• Paper 2 – calculator</li> <li>• Paper 3 – calculator</li> </ul> <p>Please ensure you have your full exam pencil case for this exam including a protractor and compass.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• It is important that you are <u>active</u> in your revision, so SENECA learning is a great place to revise topics that you haven't covered for a while. Remember, the more you use SENECA the more it learns about you and can suggest SMART learning targets.</li> <li>• <a href="#">Corbett Maths 5 a day practice questions</a>, these can be used to revise old content, which is especially powerful now you are close to finishing the course. This will also be part of the homework you will be given by your teacher over half term and will be directed to the best tier of questions for you. This will help you build these strong habits of retrieval.</li> <li>• Use your Maths Memory booklets to test yourselves and follow up on topics that you have forgotten.</li> </ul>
Performing Arts	<p>Your mock exam in Performing Arts was a "dry run" of <b>Component Three: Set Task Responding to a Brief</b>. This took place immediately after you completed your Drama Logs for Component Two in the beginning of November and finished before the Christmas holidays.</p> <p>You will receive feedback and suggestions for improvement on this Mock run of Component Three in preparation for the real exam window, which begins in January.</p>	<p>Use your class time efficiently to develop, rehearse and perform a workshop performance based on the exam brief set by Pearson. Make arrangements with your group members to rehearse your performance after school.</p> <p>This performance should last around six minutes and needs to communicate ideas and creative intentions to a specific target audience. Your group may be between three and seven performers.</p> <p>In addition to your workshop performance, you will also complete three pieces of Controlled Assessment detailing how you developed your initial ideas, the drama skills you</p>

		used during your rehearsal process and your evaluation of the final workshop performance. You will be able to prepare notes in advance for these three pieces of Controlled Assessment.
PE	The GCSE PE students have been working in core PE lessons on their chosen activities for assessment. PE staff use their judgement to mark the students work both for skills and full game/ performance context. We inform AQA of our marks and then a moderator visits the school to observe a sample of students. This will happen during March, prior to the Easter holiday.	Students need to be ready to perform in their three chosen activity areas. As an example, this could be Netball, Basketball and Table Tennis. At least one of these must be as an individual and one in a team. We recommend that students continue to spend time practicing and developing their confidence. Our experience tells us that it is tough performing under the pressure of a visiting observer! AQA GCSE PE have video ( <a href="http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=CGkOD70W82M">www.youtube.com/watch?v=CGkOD70W82M</a> ) and text information on these aspects, and it is advisable to learn from the strengths of others in a sporting context. Music	<p>The mock exam will be a condensed form of the actual exam.</p> <p>The actual exam for Music Practice consists of 2x written exams (totalling 3 hours) and 18 hours of preparation, rehearsing/ music production, and performance/ finishing productions. This will include a day off timetable. In the exam they will be creating a performance or production of an existing piece of music and changing the genre.</p> <p>The mock exam will consist of a condensed form of the above that will take place during lesson times.</p> <p>All coursework has been submitted.</p>	<p>For pupils taking the performance route:</p> <p>Practice their instrument(s). Pupils can book rehearsal rooms at lunchtimes, priority booking for Key Stage 4 (years 10 and 11) is on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Fridays. Pupils can also stay behind after school on Tuesdays to practice and rehearse.</p> <p>For pupils taking the production route:</p> <p>Continue with any existing projects using Soundtrap. Alternatively, pupils may create a production of a piece of their own choosing. Pupils can book music tech during lunchtimes, priority booking for Key Stage 4 (years 10 and 11) is on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Fridays. The studio is only for Key Stage 4 and 5. Pupils can also stay behind after school on Tuesdays to record and produce</p>
