There are several ways that students can prepare for the 90-minute exam on November 9 th . All students have an AQA GCSE PE 'Revision notes' at home and should use this regularly. Be organised and take one section at a time – for example with the 'Technology' topic, p.55-57, take 30 minutes to read, highlight and make notes on the key words that you could use in an extended answer on how Technology has helped/been used in sport. Test yourself on it – what have you retained? Repeat if needed, be honest with yourself. Alternatively, search for videos and use your notes that you have at home to develop your confidence on the topics.
