Getting familiar with exam papers make them less daunting when it comes to the real thing.</li> <li>• SENECA learning is a great place to revise topics that you haven't covered for a while. PE	<p>Students will have two Theory Exams, one in May and one in June.</p> <p>Paper 1 is in May when questions will be covering Topics 1, 2 and 3.</p> <p>Paper 2 will be in June when the focus will be on Topics 4, 5, 6 and 7.</p> <p>Each exam is 75 minutes long with 78 marks available.</p> <p>Most of the questions are short answers but there are a 6 and 9 mark extended writing challenges on both papers.</p>	<p>We have discussed this at length in class and practised it. Students have a huge number of resources at their disposal, using their class notes, Bizley Guide or videos on the internet. All topics are covered well with videos, simply search 'AQA GCSE PE' followed by the topic needed and there are a variety of options. Test yourself at home with short chunks of time devoted to content retrieval and try to practice longer answers in a similar way to how we do so in class – 10-minute challenge for a 9-mark question for example! Best of luck!</p>

Music	<p>Pupils are currently in the exam period.</p> <p>The exam for Music Practice consists of 2x written exams (totalling 3 hours) and 18 hours of preparation, rehearsing/ music production, and performance/ finishing productions. This will include a day off timetable. In the exam they will be creating a performance or production of an existing piece of music and changing the genre. The mock exam will consist of a condensed form of the above that will take place during lesson times.</p> <p>All coursework has been submitted.</p>	<p>For pupils taking the performance route:</p> <p>Practice their instrument(s). Pupils can book rehearsal rooms at lunchtimes, priority booking for Key Stage 4 (years 10 and 11) is on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Fridays. Pupils can also stay behind after school on Tuesdays to practice and rehearse.</p> <p>For pupils taking the production route:</p> <p>Continue with any existing projects using Soundtrap. Alternatively, pupils may create a production of a piece of their own choosing. Pupils can book music tech during lunchtimes, priority booking for Key Stage 4 (years 10 and 11) is on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Fridays. The studio is only for Key Stage 4 and 5. Pupils can also stay behind after school on Tuesdays to record and produce</p> <p>Pupils can also use the music analysis sheets to analyse pieces of music of their own choosing. Music analysis is an</p>

		essential skill for music, especially in regards for preparing their exam pieces.
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
